What is FBIE-SIG?

Founded in 2003, Foreign-Born International Educator Specific Interest Group (FBIE-SIG) is a group of NAFSA members with a common interest in advocating FBIE related issues within NAFSA and in the broader field of international education.

Mission Statement

The FBIE-SIG strives to provide a forum for NAFSA members to advocate for policy and regulation changes to remove obstacles for current and future foreign-born international education professionals, to serve and support foreign born international educators' professional entry and development, and to promote foreignborn standpoints and perspectives to enrich NAFSA programs and services.

History

The origin of FBIE-SIG goes back to 2001 when a few foreign-born NAFSA members started to discuss offering an FBIE related session. This was turned into a successful session at the 2002 NAFSA national conference in San Antonio, titled "No Experience? No Working Visa? Practical Advice for International Students Entering the Profession." The presenters and attendees of the session worked on petition drives in NAFSA regions the following year, and the SIG was officially approved by NAFSA in October 2003.

One of the greatest benefits of joining FBIE-SIG is networking with other FBIEs with similar professional interests and concerns. The FBIE-SIG provides its members with opportunities to connect with each other to share their experiences and knowledge about entry and professional development issues.
